A BRIEF HISTORY OF

SIMONSBERG



Fleur de Lis 1958

During a house meeting, prim Ivan Kirsten announces that the Fleur de Lis, the emblem of the French royal court, was selected as the res's badge. Braam de Vries (lyrics) and Reino Otterman (melody) compose the huislied (Reino would later become the head of the US konservatorium, and Braam a well-known Afrikaans writer).

The Met 1963

The famous Simonsberg Met is introduced. Haas Schoeman becomes the house's second Springbok, and Marius (Mossie) Mostert becomes our first film star after his role as lead actor in "In die Lente van ons Liefde".



The American Flag 1994

It was officially decided that the American flag (inspired by the Kennedy visit in 1966) would be flown with the house flag in front of the residence.



Simon2Sea 2022

The 22km run is completed for the first time, by less than 30 Simonsbergers. By 2025 this number has risen exponentially to over 100. Simon2Sea is now run yearly for mental health.

1956 Noblesse Oblige

140 students move into Simonsberg with Prof C Gunter as the first Residence Head and Gys Steyn as the first primarius. During the first house meeting on 27 February 1956, the motto Noblesse Oblige is introduced by Jan Loubser



1966 The Kennedy Visit

Another important moment in the history of our house occurred in June 1966, when United States Senator Robert F Kennedy paid a visit to Simonsberg as part of his "Ripple of Hope" tour in South Africa. We are still honoured to have hosted him on a visit that played a pivotal role in critically engaging with apartheid politics at the time.



2004 Willie-Dan Steenkamp

Willie-Dan Steenkamp passed away in his second year from leukemia. Today we celebrate his legacy through initiatives such as the Willie-Dan blood drive.



2025 70th year Reunion

In 2025, more than 400 old Simonsbergers from all over the world returned to their university home. The event was filled with memories and much joy. It truly showed how special the residence is to every Simonsberger through every generation.

MOVE IN DAY AND REGISTRATION

We invite all first years to register at Simonsberg on **Tuesday 27 January** between **09:00 - 16:30**. A small time slot for registration will also be available on Wednesday 28 January between 08:00 and 11:00 if you're unable to register on the Tuesday. You're encouraged to sleep in residence on Tuesday night, as we're planning a casual braai that evening where you'll have the opportunity to meet your fellow first years and mentors. So do try to register on the Tuesday so that you don't miss out on this special occasion. If you find yourself unable to register within these time slots, please contact the welcoming leaders regarding an arrangement. Seeing as the Law Faculty Program already starts on the 27th January, Law Students' arrival will be accommodated on the 26 January.

STUDENT CARDS

A time slot in the welcoming program has been allocated to Simonsberg for first years to have their photos taken for their student cards. Leadership bodies will be accompanying you in this regard. Without these cards, access to the residence is not possible

REGISTRATION AND CLOTHING FEE

Furthermore, we kindly request an amount of **R1170** to be paid on the day of registration at Simonsberg, as this will cover registration fees, residence clothing and all other activities during the welcoming period. Please note, that we strongly encourage you to download and make use of the **Snapscan** app as the university has moved away from cash-based transactions. If this does prove to be impossible, cash on arrival will suffice. If you are unable to bear the costs, please feel free to notify any of the three welcoming leaders beforehand and alternative arrangements will be made to assist you. All financial matters will be handled with the utmost discretion.

LOGISTICS FOR 2026

INFORMATION WITH REGARDS TO MOVING IN

ROOMS

Before you arrive at Simonsberg, you will already have been allocated a double (two-person) room. Rooms are shared for at least the first two years that you reside in Simonsberg. Please take into consideration that during the welcoming period you will have randomized room swaps in order to give you the opportunity to meet your fellow Simonsbergers and get comfortable living with a diverse group of people. After the welcoming period, before classes start you will be assigned to a final room and roommate.

WHAT'S IN MY ROOM?

All rooms are double rooms and contain the following:

- Bed and mattress
- Curtains
- Desk
- Three plugs
- Access to WIFI and Internet
- Bookshelf
- Double cupboard with hanging and packing space
- Additional storage cupboard

Every room also has network points and Wi-Fi for access to the Internet. Please note that computers and printers are also available in the residence and on campus for all to use and that it's therefore not necessary to own a computer, although it is convenient.

- A desk lamp or bedside lamp.




CLOTHING (OTHER THAN NORMAL EVERYDAY CLOTHING)

 - Various newcomer sport tournaments will also take place early on during the first term, so, if you'd like to take part in these prestigious events, we encourage you to keep fit during the holidays.



EATING

- Your own cutlery and crockery if you'd prefer to eat in your room. Cutlery from the dining hall may, under no circumstances, be taken out.
- Any other electrical appliances that can make your stay more convenient are also welcome, except for heaters or stoves. (There are water boilers and microwaves on each floor, so we urge residents to use those instead of buying kettles and microwaves.)
- We encourage you not to bring your own fridge, since it will crowd your rooms.


